ENERGY TIP

If energy bills for your home seem too high, the likely culprits are air leaks. Here are some tips from VVEC that can help you stop leaks from your home – and your wallet. Older homes, especially those built before 1994, may be plagued by leaking ducts and inadequate insulation. Leaky ductwork can reduce the efficiency of your heating and cooling system by as much as 20 percent. A good time to check for leaks is on a windy day, when you'll be able to find drafty spots. Experts recommend going after big leaks first. That means plugging all holes around chimneys, vents, water pipes, and heating system ductwork. Seal any duct leaks with mastic. Avoid the use of duct tape, which can dry out and disintegrate when used. Adding insulation to floor,

walls, and ceiling cavities can improve energy efficiency, but may be a job for a professional contractor. Once you've sealed major leaks, look for smaller ones – around windows, doors, electrical outlets, and light switches. Seal gaps around windows and doors, using caulk on non-moving parts. And replace any worn weather stripping. Caulk or expanding spray foam are perfect in spots where plumbing, wiring, vents and ducting penetrate through walls. Installing foam outlet gaskets behind electrical outlets and light switches – especially on outside walls – can save energy, too. For safety's sake, make sure all combustion appliances, such as furnaces, stoves, and water heaters, are properly vented.

Is Your Information Up-To-Date?

Current account information is important at VVEC. Contact information is confidential to VVEC and not shared with any outside (3rd Party) users.

If you have received a new phone number, have had a name change, or have an additional contact number you would like to change, it is time to update your information.

VVEC would like members to add an email address to their contact information in order to receive push notifications and important information about outages and service updates.

You can update your information by calling 918-371-2584, Monday-Friday, 7:30 AM -4:00 PM, or by filling out a form available on our website.

Scan the code with your phone camera to be taken directly to the form!





If you are in an accident or incident involving electrical equipment, remain in your vehicle or cab until the local utility arrives to de-energize power. Stepping out of your vehicle while touching it at the same time or trying to walk or run to safety can cause serious burn injuries or death.

If you are in a multiple-car accident, yell to others (from your car) to warn them not to leave their vehicle. Also warn those who might stop to help to not approach the scene. Call 9-1-1 to report the accident location and clearly state to the dispatcher that electrical lines or equipment is involved.

Utility equipment includes:

- neighborhood pad-mounted transformers (metal boxes usually green or grey);
- equipment such as a switching cabinet or junction box for underground utilities;
- overhead power lines or poles

DO NOT go near or touch electrical equipment. **DO NOT** move a downed wire with your hand or an object such as a stick.

IN CASE OF AN OUTAGE

• First, check your fuses or circuit breakers. Every service is different. You may have fuses or circuit breakers in your house, on the side of your house, under your meter, or all three places. Check to see if your neighbors have electricity.

• Then, call the co-op at 371-2584, or 1-800-870-5948. Have your account number, name as it appears on the account, and address handy to give to the dispatcher. If you should get a recording, leave your information; every message will be answered.
