When we look at outages on our OMS system we can see the medical alert symbols. However, almost all of the lines in our system have someone with a medical alert listed. This means our members should prepare to withstand a several-hour power outage. The past couple of years we have been promoting the SmartHub app and our website to report power outages. It is by far the easiest way to report outages. It is also the best way to gain the peace of mind that we know about your outage, and is being worked on, or in line to be repaired. When a feeder goes out or a severe storm blows through, thousands of members can be impacted causing the phone lines coming into our office to fill up quickly. Signing up and using SmartHub can help your co-op better serve you during outages.
